Message from Mr Harvey

Dear Parents,

This mini newsletter is to keep you informed of the room changes currently being actioned at the school.

- ◆ The building program is all 'locked in' and the last planning sessions have been completed. Starting late March 2019, both the Kindy- Pre Primary buildings and the 4 class block will commence. They will replace the transportable classrooms that are in place on those sites currently.
- ◆ To allow for the removal of the transportable classrooms, 7 classes are scheduled to move to different rooms. If your child is in any of these rooms listed below, you will need to know where to take you child in the morning and pick your child up from in the afternoon.

Already completed on Monday 19th and Tuesday 20th November

Mr Allen's Year 4 class has been relocated to Room 16 - the old LOTE room.
Entry and exit will be from the external door off the front lawn.

Miss Dalton's Year 3 class has been relocated to Room 5. (North wing)

Mrs Merritt/Mrs Ruane Year 2/3 class has been relocated to Room 9. (2 doors along)

Mrs Turner's Year 1 class has been relocated to Room 6. (South wing)

Mrs Smithall's Year 1 class has been relocated to Room 7. (South wing)

Wednesday 21st November -

Ms Home's PP1 class will be relocated to Room 14.

Ms Halse/Mrs Skane's PP2 class will be relocated to Room 15.

Thursday 22nd November and Friday 23rd November

Mrs Bromley/Ms Cawood's Kindy class will be relocated to PP1 (now known as Kindy)

- ◆ Starting next Monday, 26th November, the Education Department's transportable removal team will commence all planning and preliminary disconnections of all the transportables to make them ready to be trucked out. The trucks are huge as they take half a building each. The staff car park will be closed down to enable the safe access onto the site. The school will continue to keep parents informed. *Continued overleaf*

How parents can help

The school will inevitably have less car parking space up until the buildings are finished in 2020. I ask parents as a **matter of urgency and importance** to start coaching children to use the “Kiss and Drop” drive through, entered from Queen St and exited by Paisley St. This will work well if we all follow these basic courtesy steps.

- ◆ This lane is a set down and pick up area only.
- ◆ Kids should have their bags ready to get out of the car or into the car without delay.
- ◆ There are 350 families on our campus, please don't hold up the traffic. Coach your kids to get in and out of the car quickly and safely. (Yes parents do want a kiss goodbye)

Top tips to speed the process up.

- ◆ The driver should never get out of the car.
- ◆ Drop or pick your child up at the next convenient space.
- ◆ Kids can walk any distance along the lane to and from your car. (It's good for them as well)
- ◆ Don't every parent roll up at 3pm to get a good parking space. This is not a parking lane. Most cars are gone by 3.15-3.20pm. Perhaps you could arrange with your child that you will arrive at 3.20pm and that they will wait patiently for your arrival under the supervision of one of the Deputy Principals or Mr Harvey.
- ◆ Coach your child to be organised and observant. That way when they see you arrive to collect them they will be ready to get straight into the car so you can be on your way without holding up the traffic.

Additional note year 1 parents.

- ◆ Year 1 parents are asked to wait for your child in the UCA or alongside the library, **not** in the corridor adjacent to the classrooms. This corridor is narrow and gets too busy for you all to wait there.

I thank you all for your understanding and patience you have already shown as we start the moving and resettling process. I trust that I can rely on your continued support moving into 2019 in dealing with the obvious difficulties we may encounter with builders and trades people on site. This will be an extremely busy time around the school site, but the rewards for our school having wonderful new facilities for our students from 2020 are going to be fantastic.
